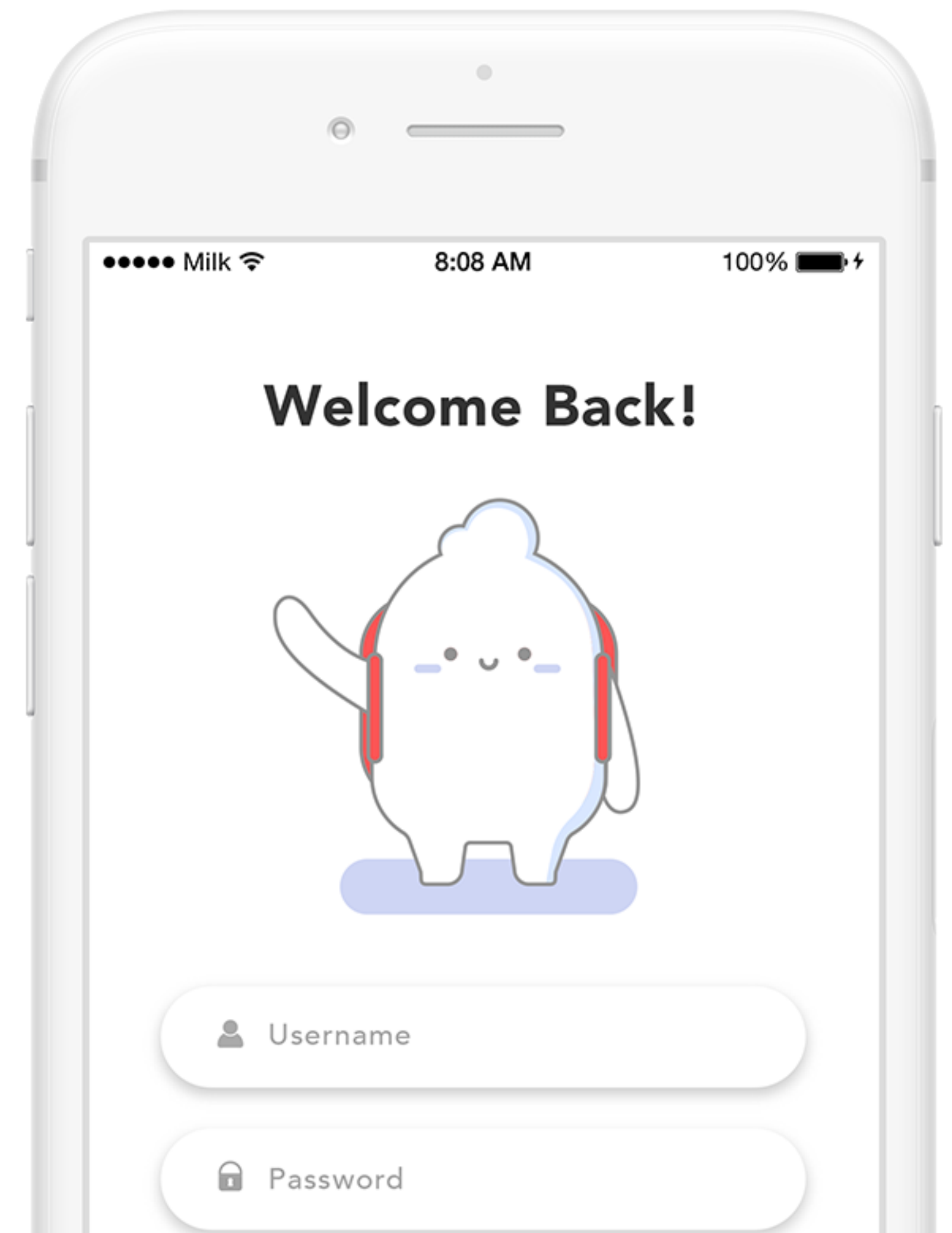
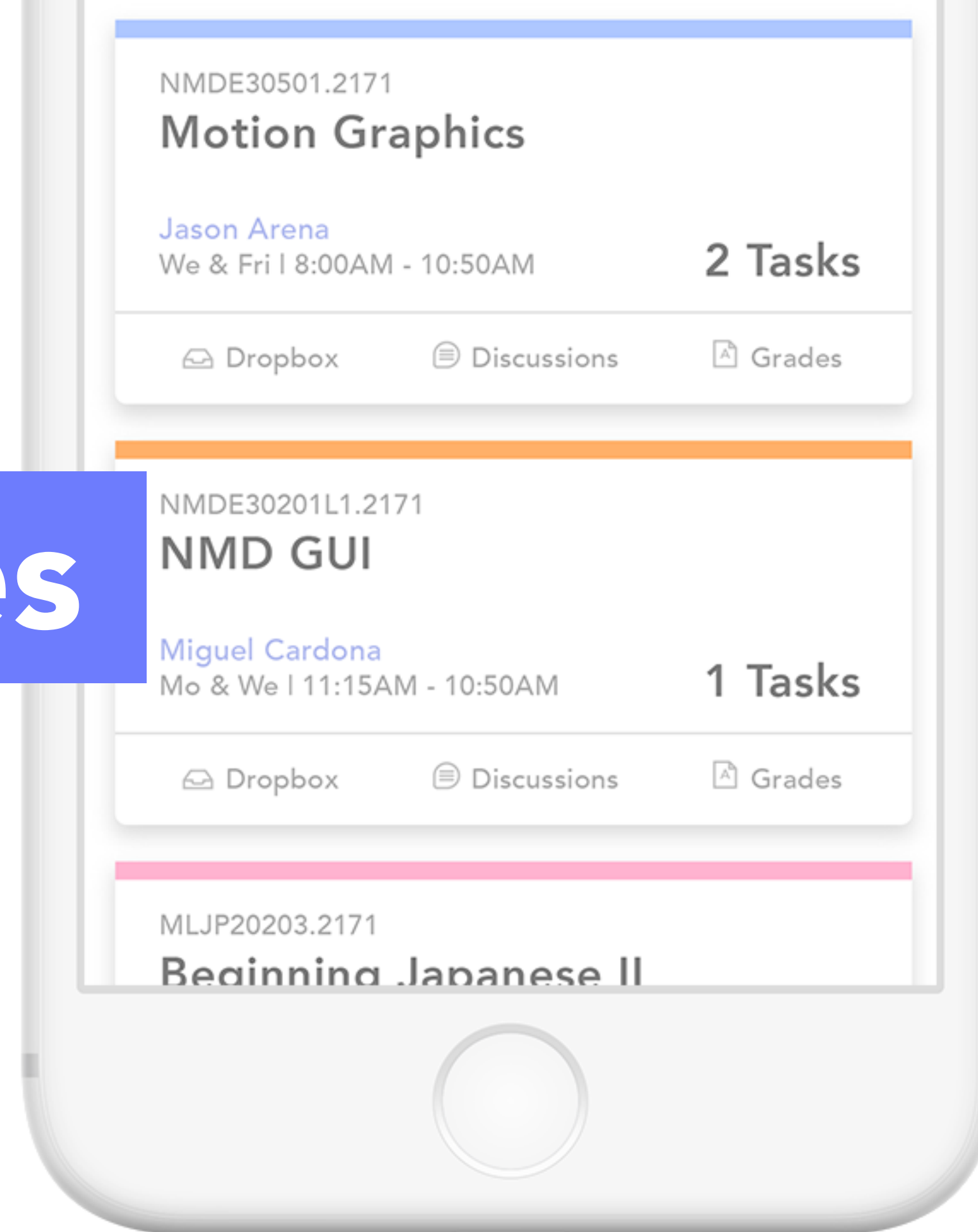


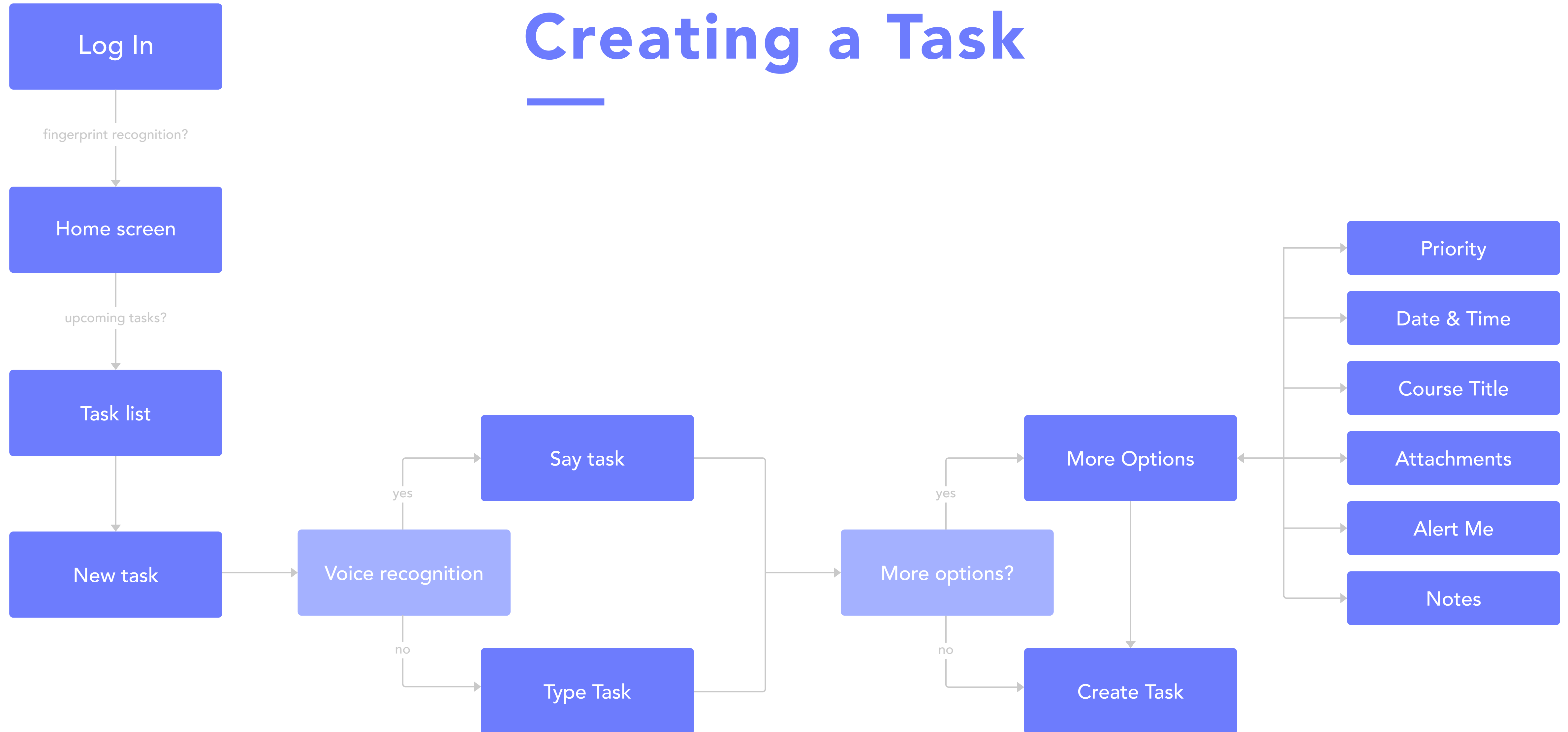
MyCourses Mobile

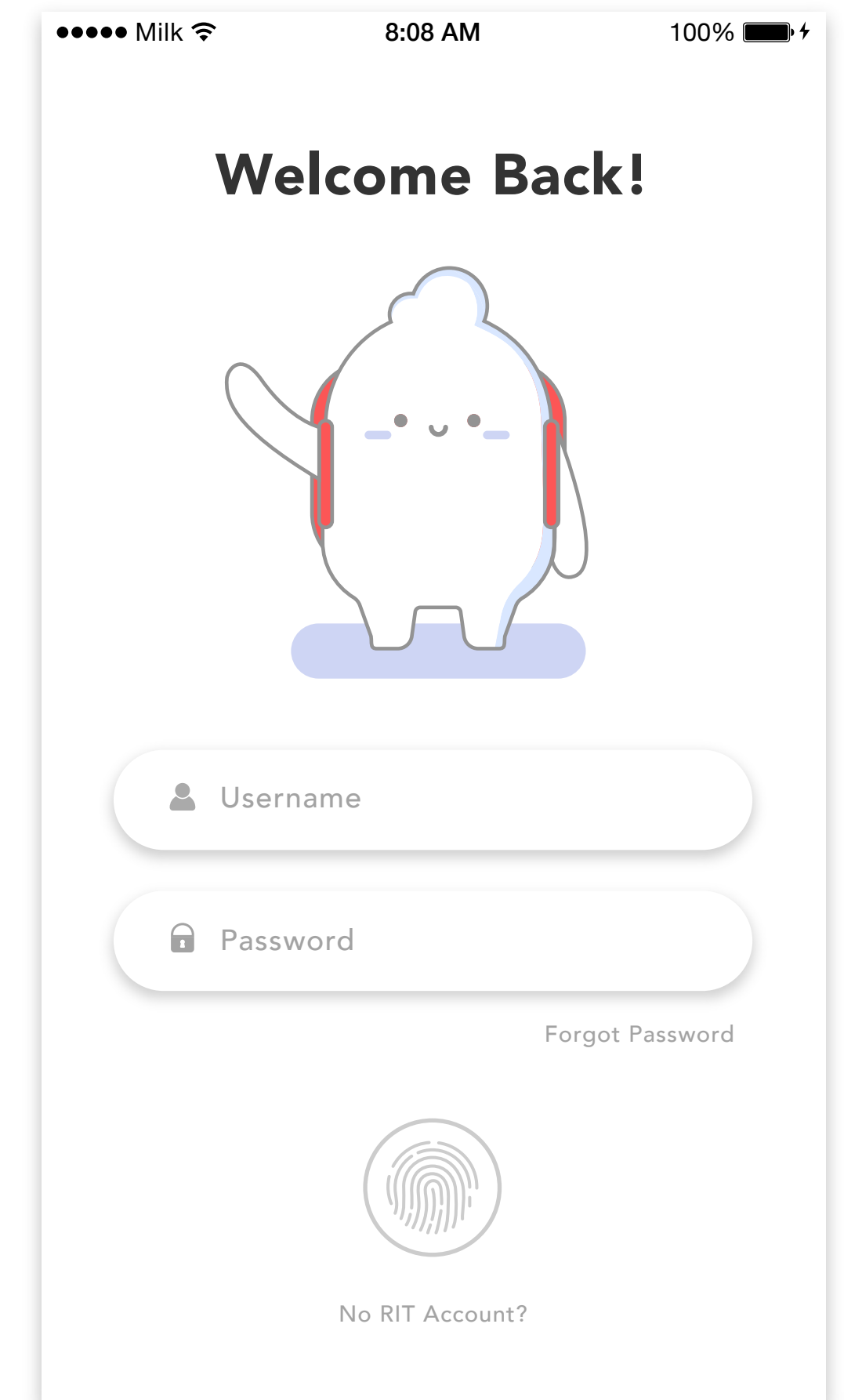
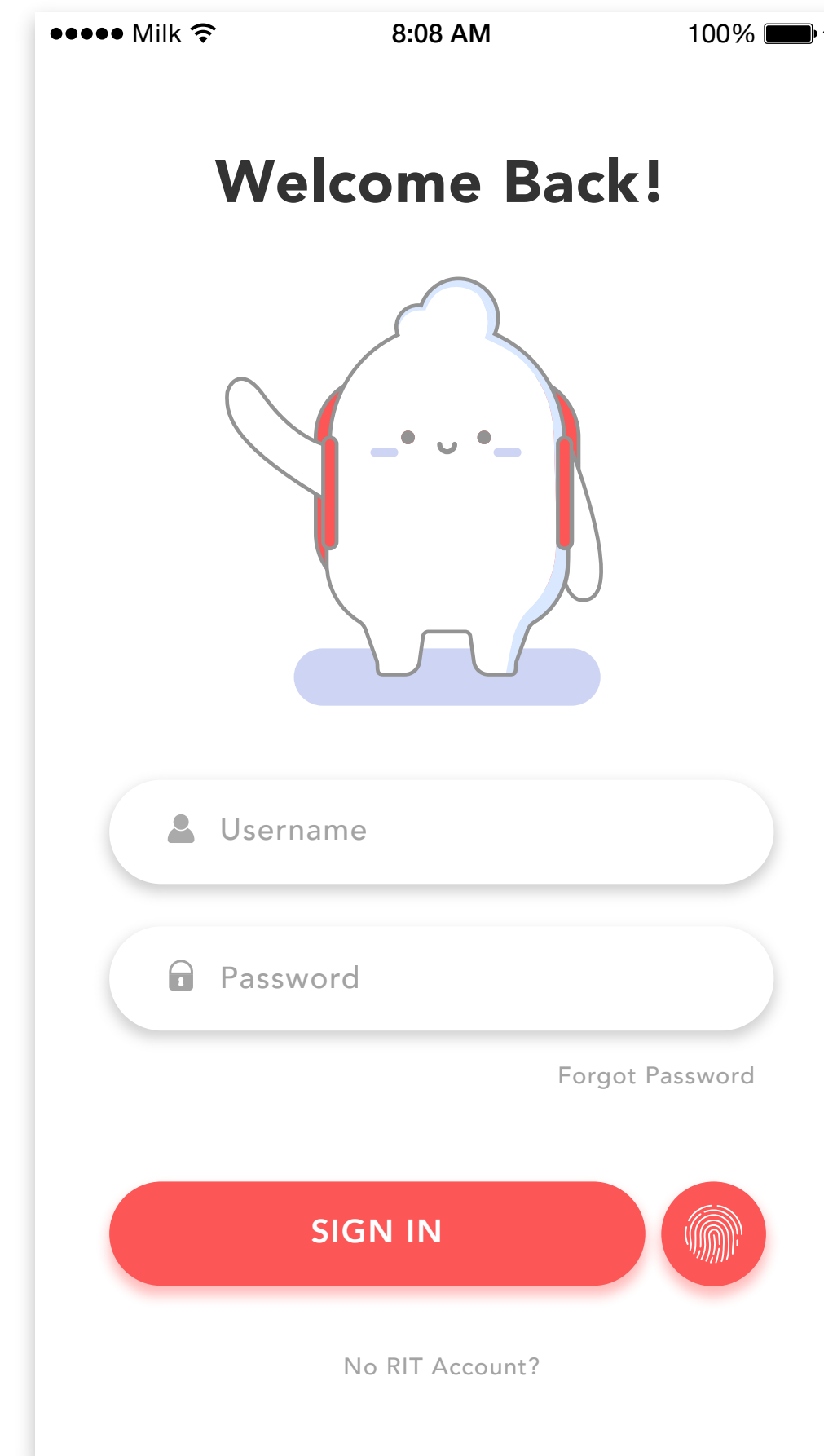

Creating a Task



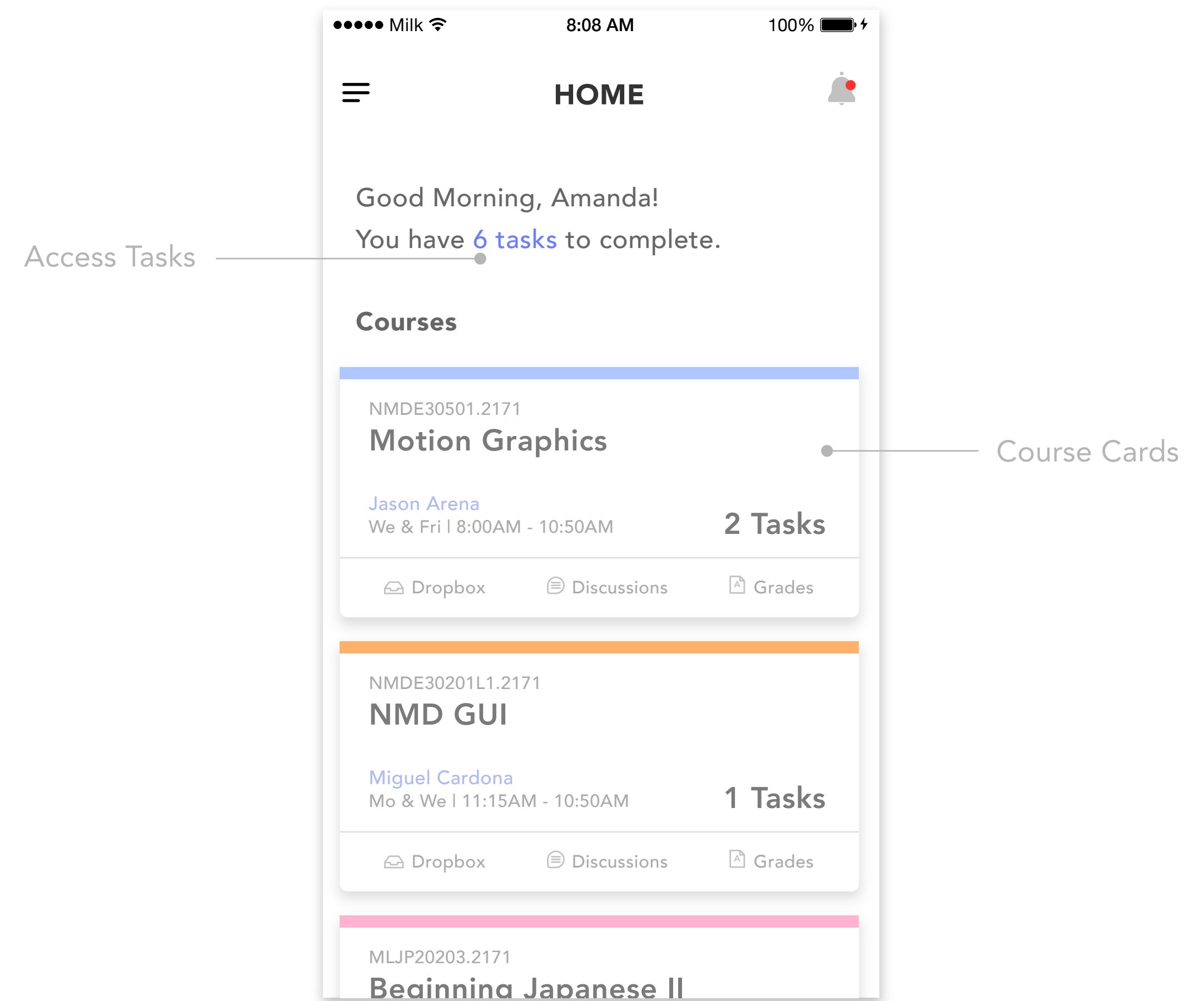
Login Page

The login page gives users the option to type in their username and password information or use fingerprint recognition to sign in to myCourses. Students who frequently access myCourses from their devices will be able to sign in with ease with the use of fingerprint recognition.



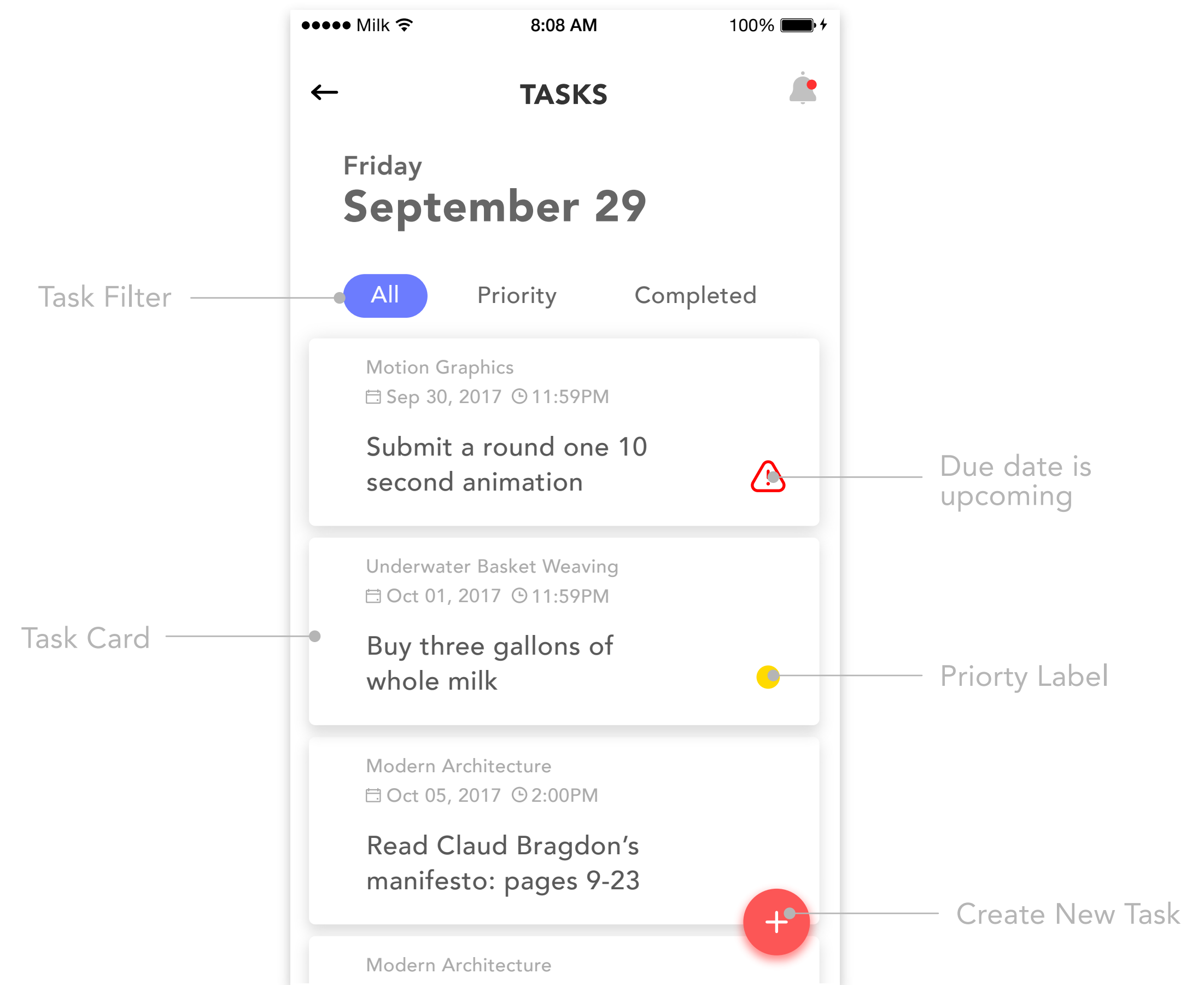
Home Screen

The home screen allows users to see how many tasks they currently have left to complete and quickly scan their courses.



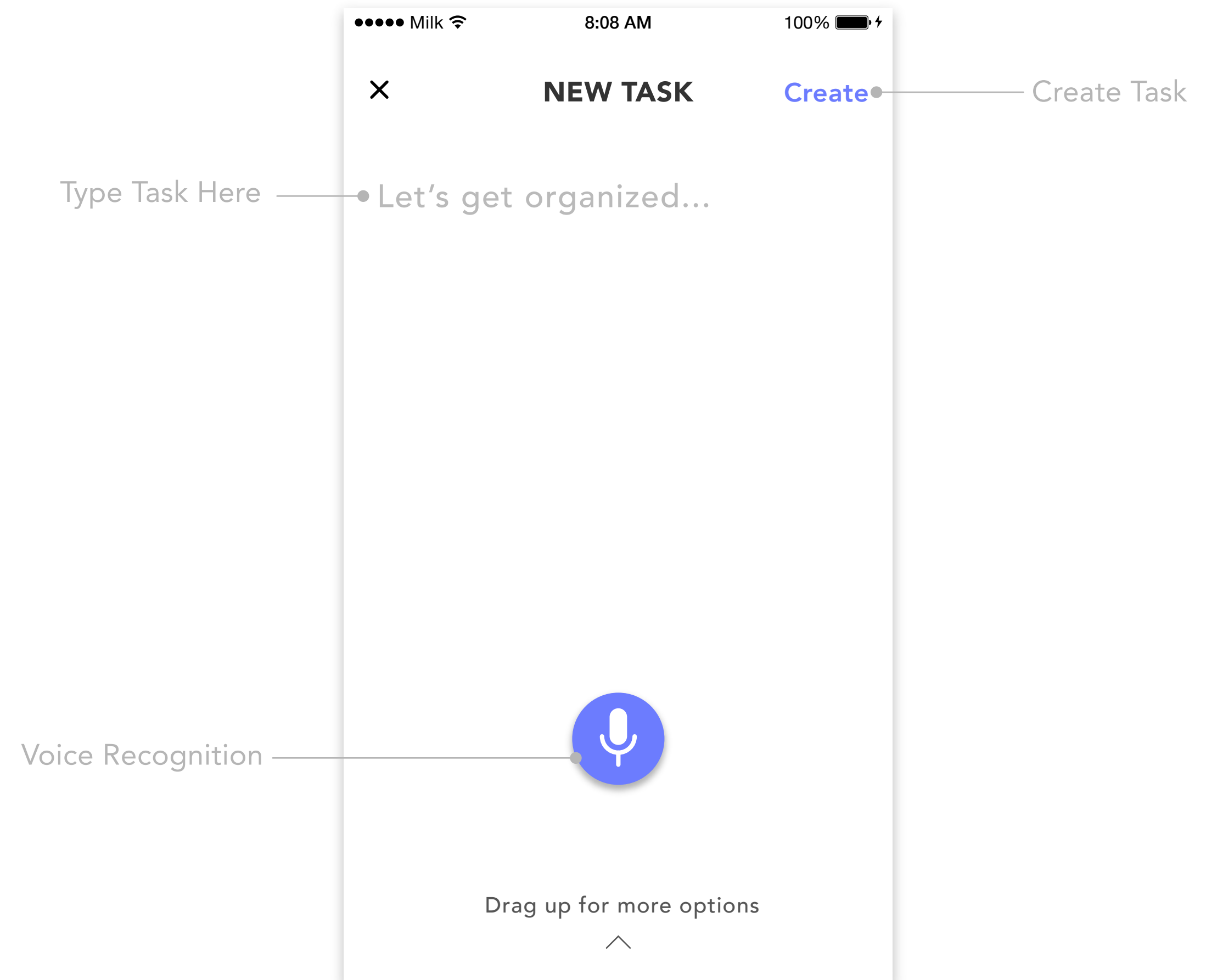
Tasklist

The tasklist allows users to quickly scan tasks that they have to complete. Tasks can be marked with priority labels which notify the user which tasks to prioritize. Tasks populate based on assignments that professors assign. Students may also create their own tasks.



New Task

Upon creating a new task, users have the option to type or say a task. For users who are in a rush, saying a task allows them to quickly create a task. After the task is written, users can either create the task or swipe up for more options.



More Options

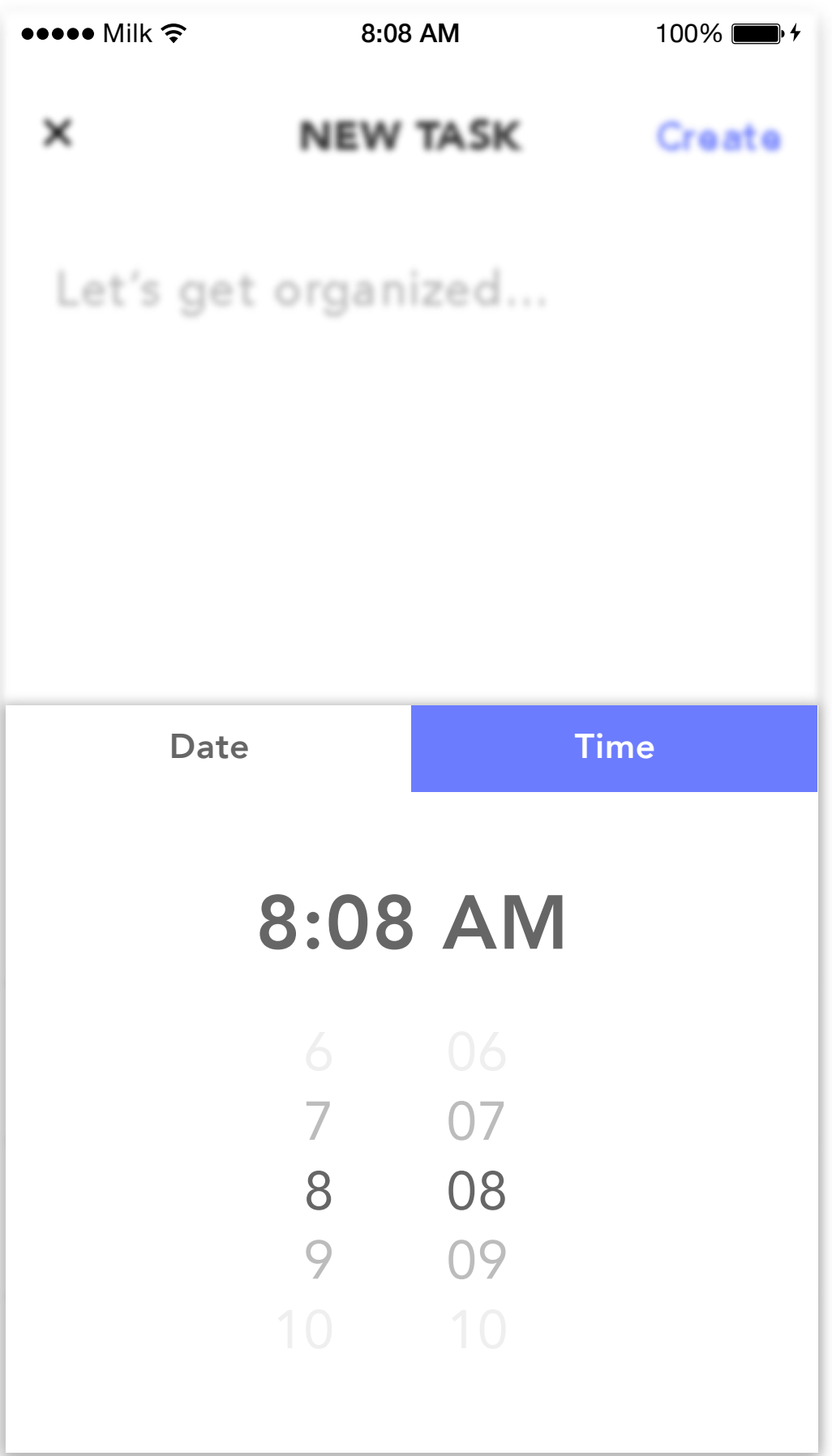
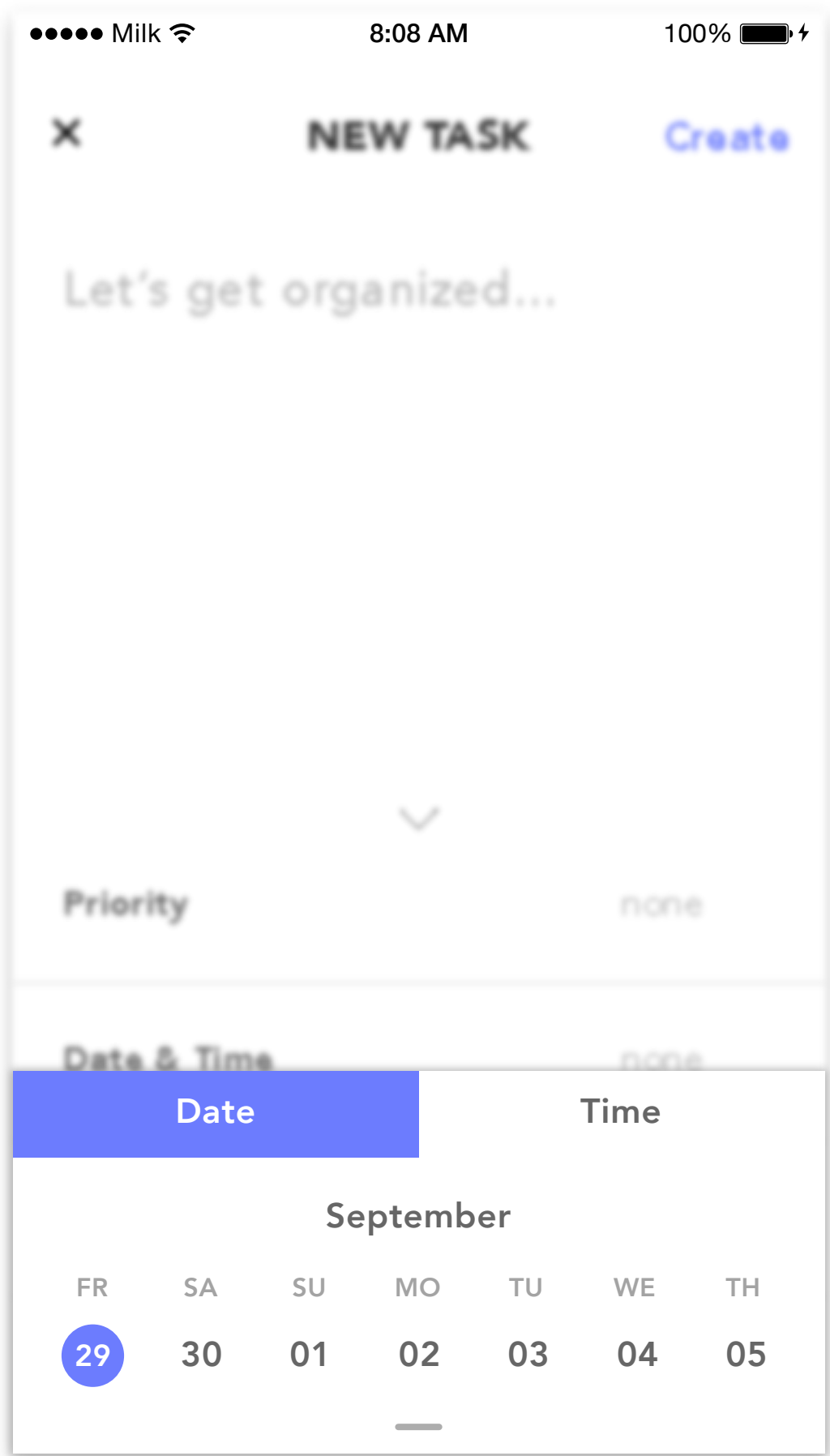
For users who would like to be more organized, there are options to better organize a task card. These options allow users to have more detailed task cards which give them more information at a glance.

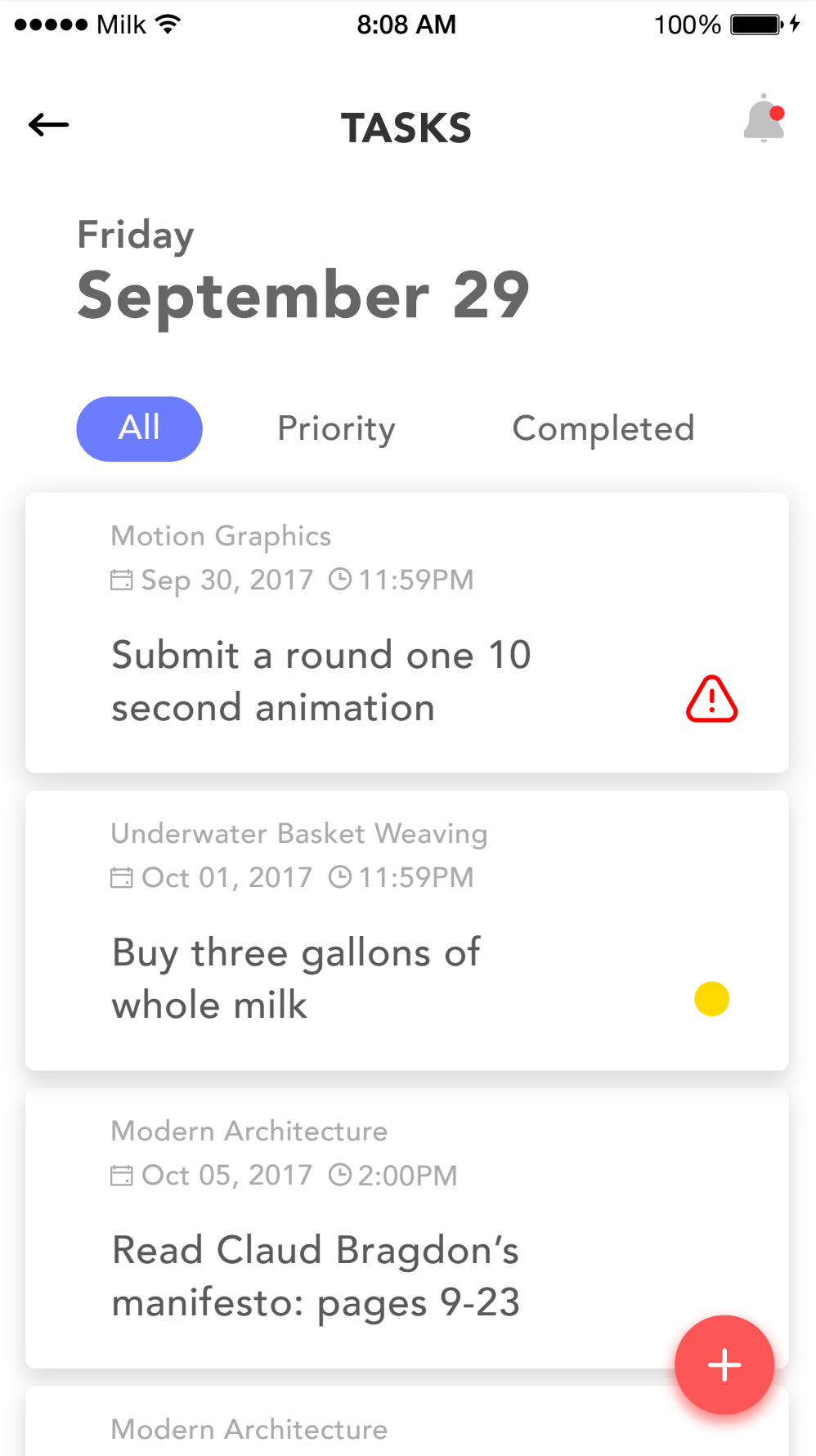
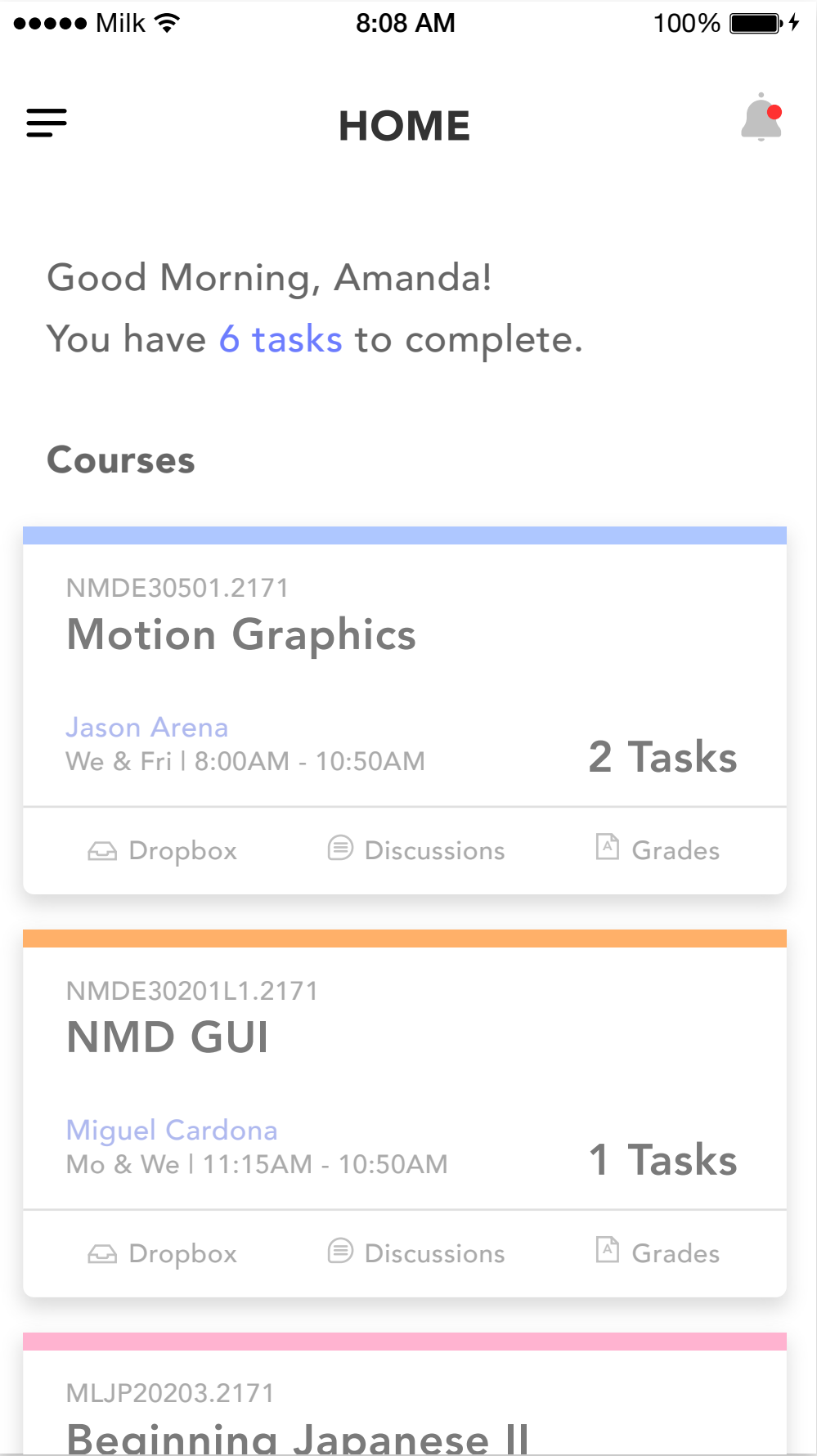
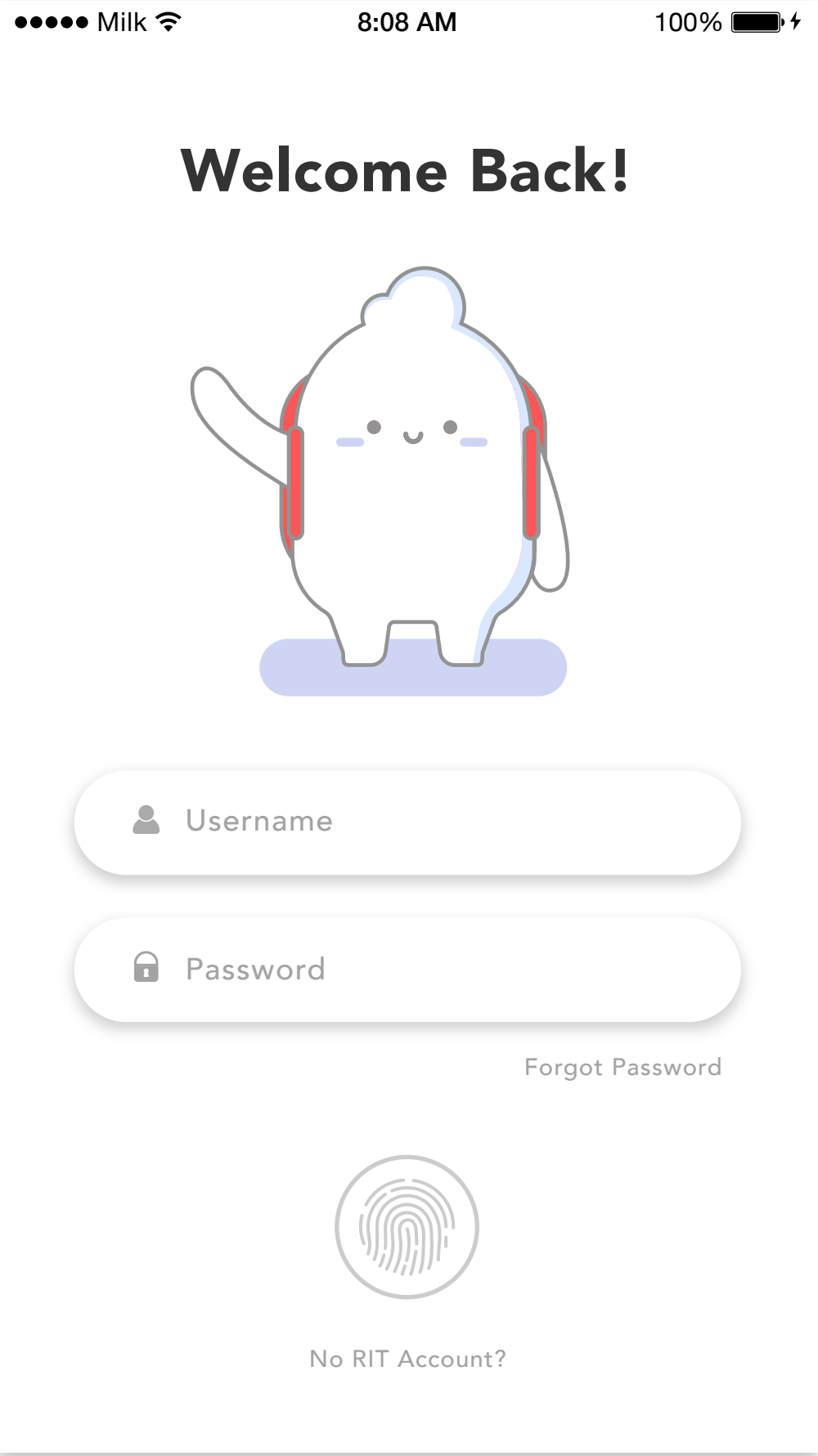
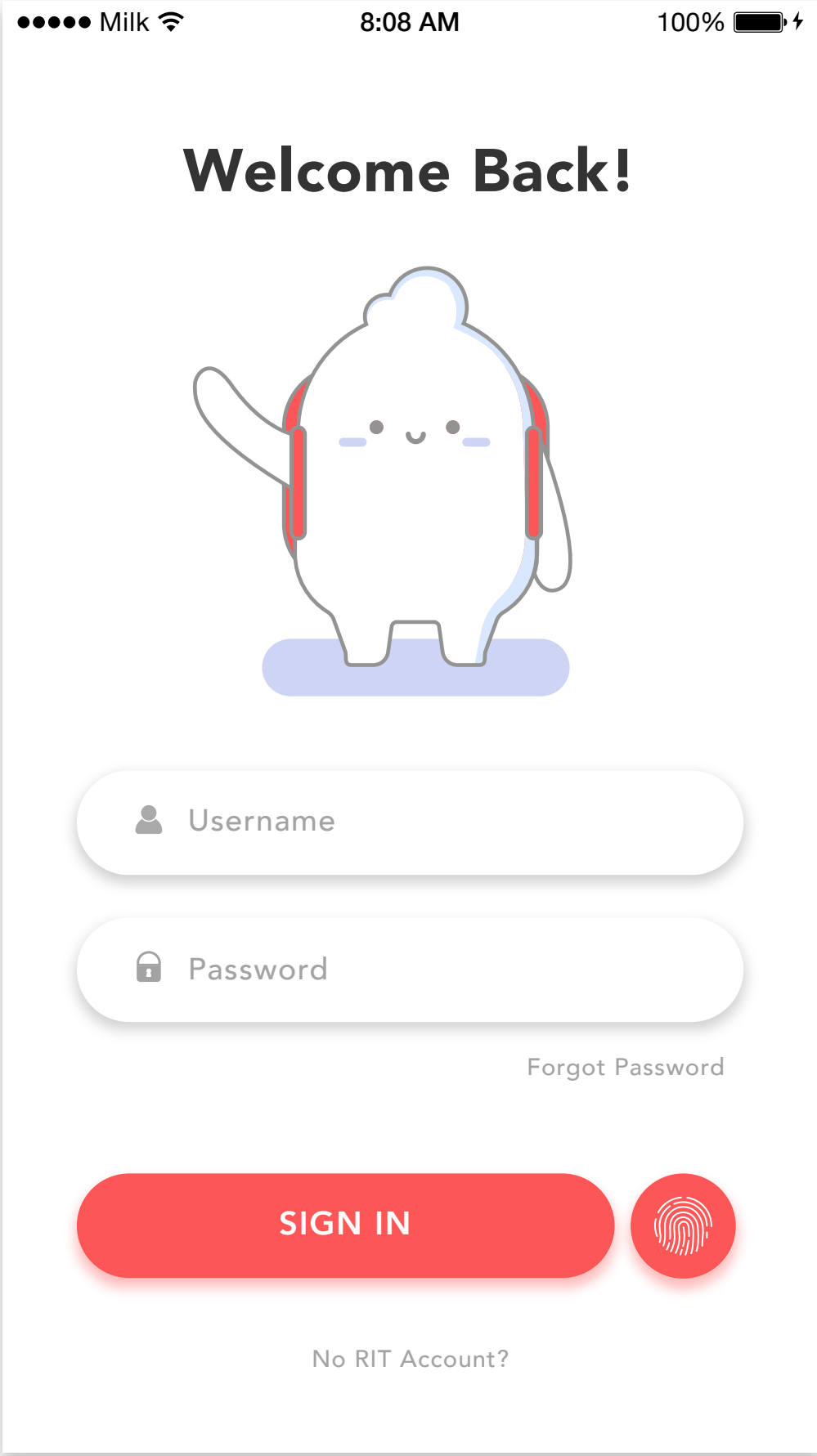
